The Source!

2 Cor 13:14 “Praising God from Whom All Blessing Flow”.

Praise God from Whom All Blessings Flow. This verse truly identifies the praise-receiving God as the source of all blessings, (God is the source of all blessings), which makes him worthy of praise and honor. This verse or statement is a Doxology (song or anthem).

This verse highlights the character and works of God. The redeemed praise God for the blessings (works) but also praises God for his generosity which he shares with his people (character). James writes, “Every good thing given and every gift is from above, coming down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no variation or shifting shadow” (James 1:17). In this text, James teaches that regeneration (being born again) is a blessing from God (v. 18). Here, James reminds the Church at large the primary blessings flowing from God is salvation (never lose sight of this truth). The next time we sing “Praise God from Whom All Blessings Flow,” keep in mind one of those blessings is salvation given to us by his grace. We never deserved it, but by grace (unmerited gift) we are saved through his blood and heirs of everlasting life.

Genesis chapters 37-50 recall the road map of Joseph’s life. He went from Jacob’s favorite son to the least liked in his siblings circle. Therefore, his brothers’ sold him into slavery, then served a lengthy prison sentence for a crime he DID NOT commit. When we think about praising God for all blessing flow, you have to add that he is a sustainer. He sustains what he has created. This shows that he is an able God. Even though Joseph was rejected, betrayed, and isolated, God provided everything he needed to get to his destiny. Joseph was able to provide sound wisdom during the seven years of famine. He received the first hand experience of God providing for him during his famine. Along the same road of sustenance, Moses reminds Israel of God’s provision of manna in the wilderness (Deuteronomy 8:2-3). In 1 Kings 17:6, God took care of Elijah with bread and meat from ravens. He has never abandoned anyone in their time of need. So the next time when we sing “Praise God from Whom All Blessings Flow,” remember how he has sustained you in the time.

In conclusion, two types of blessing were emphasized in this article. As we look back into our lives may we remember each blessing the Lord has sent to us, and let us praise God for each one of them. If you want to know the purpose God has for your life, take time to praise God. When you are discouraged and down trodden - spend time praising God. When the enemy comes in like a flood - spend time praising God. Do you need the peace of God that transcends all understanding - spend time praising God. Remember God is the source for all; when we praise God, it reminds us who is on the throne and in control. This brings assurance and hope for the future!
